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SOLIVARY IN PREŠOV

Solivar in Prešov is a national cultural monument and is one of the most important technical monuments in Slovakia. It is a unique complex of technical objects for pumping and cooking salt from brine, dating from the 17th century. The facilities for rock salt mining and brine pumping in Solivar include in particular Leopold shaft with gap, Black-salt tanks, Cooking, Huta, Salt storage,







LOOKOUT TOWER TOKAJ

The dominant feature of the Tokaj Wine Region is the 12-meter-high Lookout Tower, which is unique. The dominant feature of the Tokaj Wine Region is the 12-meter-high Lookout Tower, which is unique in its wooden barrel shape. The steel structure of the tower is completed by wooden slats. It is located in vineyards between the villages of Malá Třňa and Černochov.



MINI-MUSEUM OF WOODEN TEMPLES, L'UTINA

The mini-open-air museum was established with the aim of preserving and presenting the common heritage of the Slovak-Ukrainian border region - wooden temples, of which more than 40 have been preserved in eastern Slovakia to this day. a brief history of each temple. In one place you have the opportunity to admire more than 40 gems of folk and spiritual architecture, which are exact replicas of their originals. The wooden churches are made in a scale of 1:10. In addition to the mini-museum, one of the dominants of Lutina is a new wooden church with a lookout tower. This temple is a faithful copy of the original burnt temple.
